### The Trevor Project

Suicide, especially youth suicide, has proven to be an important and growing public health concern. Working in the injury prevention field, we know that certain populations are disproportionately affected by suicide. According to the CDC, a study of youth in grades 7-12 found that lesbian, gay, and bisexual youth were more than twice as likely to have attempted suicide as their heterosexual peers. Some risk factors linked to being gay or bisexual include being in a hostile environment and the effects that this has on mental health. The Trevor Project is an organization that offers programs and services to LGBTQ youth that create safe, accepting and inclusive environments over the phone, online and through text. The goals for the Trevor Project include providing crisis services, peer support, research, education and public awareness and advocacy. Some of the free services on their website include:

### Crisis Interventions

- **Trevor Lifeline**—The only national 24/7 crisis intervention and suicide prevention lifeline for LGBTQ young people under 25, available at 1-866-488-7386.

- **TrevorChat**—A free, confidential, secure instant messaging service for LGBTQ youth that provides live help from trained volunteer counselors, open daily.
- **TrevorText**—A free, confidential, secure service in which LGBTQ

### ODH Launches Emergency Department Comprehensive Care Project

On Mar. 1, 2021, the Ohio Department of Health launched phase two of the Emergency Department Comprehensive Care (EDCC) project with funds provided by the CDC's Overdose to Action grant. The goal of the project is to implement comprehensive systems of care for patients who present in the emergency department with opioid use disorder.

Program interventions will largely consist of implementing sustainable, evidence-based practices for **opioid use disorder in an emergency room setting. Initiatives include implementation of opioid screening protocols, buprenorphine induction, naloxone distribution, successful linkage to ongoing treatment, peer support, and warm handoffs to ancillary services that address social determinants of health.**

The emergency department is a critical point of intervention for individuals with substance use disorder, proving the opportunity to initiate evidence-based treatment and link to other clinical supports and wrap around services. Since the initiation of EDCC project, 183,000 emergency department patients have been screens for OUD and approximately 750 emergency department staff have been trained in comprehensive care practices.

### Symptoms of Depression, Anxiety, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, and Suicidal Ideation Among State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Public Health Workers During the COVID-19 Pandemic — United States, Mar.-Apr. 2021

Among 26,174 surveyed state, tribal, local, and territorial public health workers, 53% reported symptoms of at least one mental health condition in the past 2 weeks. Symptoms were more prevalent among those who were unable to take time off from work or who felt bullied, threatened, or harassed because of work.

A new CDC infographic shows the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and how preventing ACEs can help create neighborhoods and communities where every child thrives.

**This infographic showcases data from the CDC-Kaiser Permanente ACE Study and recent findings to address the following questions:**

- What are ACEs?
- How common are ACEs?
- How do ACEs affect our lives?
- How do ACEs affect our society?
- What can be done about ACEs?

ACEs are potentially traumatic events in childhood (0-17 years), such as neglect and experiencing or witnessing violence. However, types of early adversity can be stopped before they start. Safe, stable, and nurturing relationships and environments have a positive impact in creating positive childhood experiences. Their benefits can last a lifetime.

## Action Group Updates

### Ohio Overdose Prevention Network (OOPN)

#### Ohio Overdose Awareness Day – Aug. 31, 2021

Governor Mike DeWine signed a bill declaring Aug. 31 as Ohio Overdose Awareness Day to help raise awareness and remember the lives lost to the opioid epidemic. State flags displayed at public buildings will be flown at half-staff in remembrance of the lives lost to overdose. Communities across Ohio are observing this day with campaigns and special events:

- **Licking County Health Department** is planning a harm reduction campaign in the week leading up to Ohio Overdose Awareness Day by working with Project DAWN partners to increase awareness and resource availability within their agency and promote their ability to distribute naloxone. In addition, their local coalition will be hosting two naloxone pop-up events in outlying areas of the county, identified as hotspots using ODMAP.
- **Erie County Health Department** is working with coalition partners Project Noel and Sandusky Artisans and using local community health assessment data to increase awareness within other local coalitions. They are also supporting recovery communities and Project Noel to support a Candlelight Vigil for individuals lost to overdose on August 31.
- **Ross County Health District** will be sharing awareness materials on their social media pages. In addition, they will be placing yard signs and flags in front of the health department. Each flag will represent an overdose fatality that occurred in Ross County in the last year.

In recognition of Ohio Overdose Awareness Day, the Ohio Overdose Prevention Network (Ohio OPN) will **host a statewide training series: Communities of Care: Developing Person-Centered Systems**, on Aug. 31 to support the professional development of those dedicated to preventing overdoses. The trainings will address health equity tools for overdose prevention programs, the integration of peer support in a variety of community settings, and harm reduction. ### Toledo-Lucas County Health Department

Toledo-Lucas County Health Department implemented a mobile naloxone distribution and syringe services through the Northwest Ohio Syringe Service (NOSS). They have formed partnerships with treatment agencies to provide services on their property monthly and moved most of their stationary clinics to outdoor/mobile settings in order to engage the community better. This sprinter van is a temporary rental and they are working on purchasing a permanent mobile overdose education and naloxone distribution clinic through the HEALing Communities Study. ### **Nationwide Children's Hospital**

### **Sylvania Township Fire Department**

The Health, Education, Resource, and Outreach (HERO) program is a community paramedicine program being piloted with the Springfield Township Fire Department and the Sylvania Township Fire Department, to provide assistance to residents in that area who wish to age in place. Older Adults in their jurisdictions are referred to the HERO program by first responders and police officers. Partnerships with local businesses have supplied home modification supplies for this program. The fire departments are working towards a pay it forward program that would allow future community members in need to receive the same benefits. Many of their community members are often aging in place with limited support in the area. Some of their community members have challenge with physical limitations and medications. They work with their doctors and their care teams including local social service type agencies in the county and townships to bridge gaps and in some instances explain further the situation. In their first year, this program reached 48 community members. Of those, there was an approximate 80% reduction in a new 911 calls after their last non- emergency visit. Additionally, they have expanded this program to include assisting Mercy Health/Toledo-Lucas County Health Department to provide in-home COVID-19 vaccinations for homebound.
